PER CURIAM:

James Wesley Smith III, appointed counsel for Desburn Pinnock, has filed a

motion to withdraw on appeal, supported by a brief prepared pursuant to Anders v. California, 386 U.S. 738, 87 S.Ct. 1396, 18 L.Ed.2d 493 (1967). Our independent review of the entire record reveals that counsel's assessment of the relative merit of the appeal is correct. Because independent examination of the entire record reveals no arguable issues of merit, counsel's motion to withdraw is **GRANTED**, and the district court's denial of Pinnock's 18 U.S.C. § 3582(c)(2) motion is **AFFIRMED**.
